Thank you to every precious person reading this, for caring to inquire and pray for Jay at this critical time of his initial healing stage. Learning to take it easy will be a challenge, he has a dedicated team around him including his four sons and I. Before surgery I was sent to Yad Sarah, (The hand of Sarah) to get the walker he would need. This service organization is run by volunteers, and the lady who served me said, "During the Holocaust, my mother was hidden in a bunker for 6 months with 15 others. She was starving to death, I was a new born, but she kept nursing me and I lived." One never knows who one will meet in this place.

Tim King, an old family friend wrote this shortly after his recent visit to the hospital. "I went to see Jay at Sha'ar Tzdek hospital after his operation, which turned out to be post op Intensive Care. The door was locked, I spoke into the intercom, the door opened, and I barged in. A very kind nurse at the station said, 'Yes, Mr. Rawlings is here, you have ONE minute.' He was totally unaware of my presence. Seeing him as I did made me think of all that you two have done for so many. It is now your turn to receive from us. Dear dear friends, we are standing with you, and are not far away during this very challenging time. And... so I simply prayed just ONE minute for complete healing, and that not one day of his life would be cut short! Obviously, this whole process is quite serious, and my wife, Martha and I just want you to know that we are right there with you. You probably hear that from a lot of people, but you should. Jay is loved by many.... and we care. Please do receive it and don't be bashful if you need our help."



Jerusalem the city where the Almighty Put His Name

We now celebrate the 50th anniversary of Jerusalem's unification under Israeli sovereignty in 1967. When the city was liberated tough IDF solders wept. The old city of Jerusalem was pillaged, utterly ruined by the conquering Jordanian army and Palestinian fighters from 1948 to 1967. The Jewish quarter was decimated. In fact both, synagogues and churches were used for latrines and stables. Our God is in the inheritance business, and sees that his children receive what is rightfully theirs. "Then it shall be after I have plucked them out, that I will return and have compassion upon them, and bring them back, everyone to his heritage and everyone to his land." Jeremiah 12:15: Jews began their return in the 1880's, after the Roman dispersion and destruction of Jerusalem in 70 AD as prophesied by Jesus who wept. Why? She did NOT know the day of her visitation...

"Rejoice with Jerusalem, be glad with her, all you who love her;" Isaiah 66:10a

This scripture is written in the command form. We must love what God loves, and hate what He hates. Lets never forget that He hates iniquity and sin, not human beings. Today, Jerusalem is a place of inspiration, commerce and worship for Jews, Christians and some Muslims. She is beautiful with her gardens and parks. The Old City is bathed in light at night, as the Israelis rejoice in her liberation. She is becoming one of the world's top 6 high-tech cities due to ground breaking innovate contributions made globally.

Sadly these are the days of the 'Controversy of Zion'. Read Psalm 2. But our God who sits in the heavens shall laugh. Read Psalm 2. Israeli President Rivlin called for a *Jerusalem International Prayer Breakfast.The International Christian Embassy* (of which Jay and I are both founders) helped with the preparations. When Jews and Christians work, learn and pray together GREAT things can happen!

...inquire of the Lord:

The Bible describes David as 'a man after God's own heart'? Why? He, like you and I made lots of mistakes... Well, I believe it was because we often read that "he inquired of the LORD." That description grabs my heart, my

attention. Do we want to be like that? Lets peek at Psalm 122, written for all who believe in the God of Israel and His Messiah. Again, It is in the command form to pray for the peace of Jerusalem. The key is the word *PRAY* - *Sha'al* in verse 6. Being mindful of the power of prayer, I hope you will appreciate this. PRAY in Hebrew means: to ask, inquire, request, pray, desire, wish for, and demand! Talk about insistence... not letting go. In this psalm we are told "to ask for" or "inquire about" **God's people and for the sake of the Lord's house** (v. 8, 9). More and more Christians are waking up to the importance of Israel, but just how many are "inquiring about God's people...?" For example, in the last two months, we have had limited financial support! I am very surprised by this and I hope you are as well. I am not referring at all to the handful of older faithful saints that have worked with us for decades! So this is our call according to Psalm 122: I write the points in 1st person singular... get it!

- I am instructed to seek Jerusalem's good. to inquire earnestly about her welfare.
- I am to ask with true concern about her condition.
- I am to "ask for" or "request" Jerusalem's peace as a mother would request <u>a wanted child.</u> I personally know this kind of prayer, because *I inquired of the Lord for our youngest son, and was heard on high. I joyfully gave birth to Daniel at the age of 46 in Jerusalem.* Psalm 85: 5,6.

BLESSED BE THE NAME...

God's 4 letter name 'ni' yod hey vav hey in Hebrew... is the essence of the verb TO BE. Moses said His name is "I AM" (in English.) During Tabernacle and Temple times The High Priest uttered this name once a year on Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, when he entered the Holy of Holies asking for forgiveness of sin for himself, his family and the nation of Israel, AND the surrounding nations. It was a fearful moment. Even today Jews say, Ha Shem or Adonai or Lord, instead of *The Name*. But God is our Creator, and has worked the essence of HIS NAME into our very ordinary daily vocabulary. For example: You ask me who I am, I respond: "I am Meridel."

Unknowingly, I am using HIS HOLY NAME every time I refer to myself, because I came from Him. Selah!

Just pause and consider that for a moment! How sweet and profound and intimate are His ways, defining us!


Gates of Righteousness


world, to take 'refresher' courses. The gravity of life and sense of purpose


